Central Valley Medical Center is turning 25 years old this month!

The hospital began in 1952 as Juab County Hospital, and was first owned by Juab County. The old hospital was located at 549 North 400 East, in Nephi.

In 1984 under the direction of Gaylord Swim and Mark Stoddard, CEO, Central Valley Medical Center was officially born. The hospital became a 501 (c) (3) not

-for-profit corporation, and as such provides over \$2 million dollars in charitable care annually.

In 2001 the current facility was completed. Just five years later, in 2006, CVMC expanded adding a new retail pharmacy, home health building, same day surgery center, additional patient rooms, specialty clinic, education areas, and a new day care center.

New Mini C-Arm Imaging Equipment

The radiology department at CVMC has something to boast about these days... it's a new mini C-arm X-ray system.

The imaging equipment is especially useful in the operating room during surgical procedures where it is used to provide real time X-rays of extremities. In the emergency room, the mini C-arm will be convenient for fracture reductions.

The new equipment is smaller and more convenient to move around; making it easier to take X-rays in any environment. Plus the radiation dose is significantly less than from a larger C-arm, allowing surgeons to use it in the operating room without wearing a heavy lead apron.

The new C-arm system functions by carrying an X-ray source and a detector op-

posite one another at its ends and can be swiveled around the subject in multiple axes. This allows for multiple projection without repositioning the patient. For example, a surgeon can view real time placement of hardware, and in the case of fracture reduction, a physician can view real time as bones are manipulated into proper alignment.

Organ Donation—Utah Leads the Nation

Spring is just around the corner and so is National Donate Life Month. April is National Donate Life Month, a month where organizations like Intermountain Donor Services and Utah's Donate Life Coalition raise awareness about the need for organ, eye, blood and tissue donation.


This year, as in many previous years, citizens of Utah should be proud that we lead the nation in the number of people saying yes to donation. Currently, over 70% of Utahns (the highest percentage in the nation) have signed up on the Yes Utah Donor Registry to express their donation wishes.

While this is great news, there is always more to be done. Many people have re-

cently asked, if you have all those people signed up, why is there still such a shortage of organs available for transplant? The obituary pages are full every day, so what's going on? These are excellent questions.

What few people realize is that to become a donor, someone has to die in the hospital on a ventilator. In any given year, there is the potential for about 80 organ donors out of the 6,000 deaths a year in Utah. This means that approximately one out of every 75 deaths in Utah could be an organ donor. Each organ donor has the potential to save nine lives, so every single donor is vitally important to saving the lives of fellow



Utahns.

While 70% of people signing up on the Yes Utah Donor Registry sounds impressive, and it is, there is still more to do. When asked in professional surveys "In general, do you support or oppose the donation of organs and tissue for transplant?" 96% of Utahns say they support donation. So where are the other 26% who haven't signed up? Typically it is due to a myth or misconception about donation.

We want to help dispel those myths and misconceptions that keep people from saying "yes" to donation, even though they may support it.
